- Church of England maintains **15,700** churches
- 78% are listed and expensive to maintain
- 57% are in rural areas where only 17% of the population live
- 91% of rural churches are listed compared to 55% of urban churches
- Church of England is responsible for the upkeep of 45% of England's Grade 1 listed buildings


'Listed buildings are a millstone around our necks, sapping the energy of our wider social and religious mission, and transforming the church into a buildings department of the heritage industry'.



- Average capital expenditure on upkeep is £10,000 per church per year
- £157m in total per year
- In 2006 CofE estimated a required £925m repair work in the next 5 years
- They spent £110m every year up until 2011



02. Virtuous Circles



1. Discretion

As little alteration to the exterior of the church as possible.

2. Reversibility

Intervention should be demountable and removable, leaving the church interior as complete as possible


3. Curation


Design should be underpinned by analysis of significance and where possible contribute positively to the setting of the interior

4. Retention

The chancel should remain unaltered where possible and available for quiet contemplation and prayer























- Diocese of Hereford is statistically the most rural Diocese:

 1379 residents per church building










Approved Outcomes

- A branding and marketing action plan.
- Five themed bookable tourism experiences and promote them to overseas visitors.
- A range of themed trails covering a variety of topics. Undertake a programme of 12 tourism training workshops delivered in support of church volunteers to test and ratify information for producing a jointly branded Church Tourism Handbook.
- Trial 10 contactless giving points and visitor counters in 20 churches.

How will the outcomes be achieved?

- Churches Tourism Officer to work with partners, Herefordshire and Shropshire Churches Tourism Groups, member churches and tourism and community interests.
- With the dedicated support of partners, member churches and volunteers.

The role will include

- Guidance for church members is included in the project, ensuring volunteers are knowledgeable in understanding the needs of visitors.
- The churches chosen for the trials will be encouraging volunteers to get personally involved. Technology will also be a vital part of the support for trial churches.
- Sharing skills and knowledge



Next Steps People, Belief, Heritage

- Focus on the needs of people.
- Building strong working relationships.
- Respect and nurture the sharing of knowledge, experience and skills.
- Act as ambassadors for the project.
- Monitor, evaluate and share findings.
